

## Transfer Admission Agreement (TAA) - Dominican University of California & Santa Rosa Junior College

The purpose of this agreement is to strengthen the relationship between Santa Rosa Junior College and Dominican University of California by creating new avenues of opportunity for Santa Rosa Junior College students who are interested in transferring to Dominican University of California. Enrolling over 125 new transfers each year, Dominican recognizes transfer students as a vital part of the campus community.

Under the terms of this agreement, qualified Santa Rosa Junior College students [entering the undergraduate Day program as full-time students](#) will be eligible for:

- \* guaranteed admission at junior-level status
- \* a special incentive grant of \$1,500 upon matriculation at Dominican University
- \* a waiver of the \$40.00 application fee
- \* a Dominican e-mail account
- \* a Dominican ID card
- \* access to Dominican's Library and online information resources
- \* free admission to Dominican athletic events and use of the Conlan Recreation Center

Students who are admitted [to the undergraduate Day program and maintain full-time status](#) will also qualify for an academically renewable transfer merit scholarship ranging from \$5,000 - \$10,000 per year based on the student's transfer grade point average. [The special incentive grants and the transfer merit scholarships are available for undergraduate Day students only. Students entering the Pathways evening adult program automatically receive discounted tuition.](#)

TAA's may be written for Santa Rosa Junior College students who:

- 1) have already completed at least 30 semester transferable units (Santa Rosa Junior College courses #1 - 99), and will complete at least 60 semester transferable units before enrolling at Dominican University of California. *Students with more than 60 units of baccalaureate level coursework should be advised that a maximum of 70 lower division semester units are applicable to the number needed to graduate from Dominican University of California.*
- 2) have a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 for all transferable coursework. *Students must have this GPA at the time their TAA is written and must maintain it throughout the remainder of their transfer work at Santa Rosa Junior College.*

To qualify for admission under a TAA for Fall, the student must have completed all specific courses required for minimum DU eligibility, as outlined below, by the end of the previous Spring semester. To qualify for admission under a TAA for Spring, all specific courses required for minimum DU eligibility, as outlined below, must be completed by the end of the previous Fall semester. Students may use summer session to complete 60 transferable semester units, however summer session may not be used to complete specific courses required for admission.

A Transfer Admission Agreement (TAA) may be prepared and signed [as early as](#) one year before a student enrolls at Dominican University of California (DU) on a space available basis. Guaranteed admission does not constitute guaranteed on-campus housing.

A qualified student seeking enrollment with a TAA may submit the Application [for Admission as early](#) one year before, and no later than one month before, the starting date of the desired term of entry.

Transfer Admission Agreements are intended for people who are established students at Santa Rosa Junior College. The student must be enrolled at Santa Rosa Junior College and be in good academic and disciplinary status when the agreement is written, and throughout the remainder of their transfer work.

Copies of the following documents must be sent with the TAA to be reviewed by the DU representative (unofficial copies are acceptable for TAA process but must be followed up with official transcripts at time of matriculation): a transcript from each college or university in which the student has enrolled or has attended; test scores from Advanced Placement (AP) or International Baccalaureate (IB) Higher Level examinations if they were taken.

If a student has attended a college or university outside of the United States, the correct name and address of each foreign school must be reported. Word-for-word English translations and course-by-course credential evaluations are required.

### Dominican University Majors with 55+ required units

The following majors are those that may take longer than 2 years to complete after transfer to Dominican University of California if no lower division courses in the major have been taken at Santa Rosa Junior College:

**Art** – 62-72 units for BA, 78 units for BFA

**Music** – 51 units for BA, 67 units for BA/Performance

**Biology** – 56-58 units for BA, 69-71 units for BS - Molecular Cell Biology emphasis;

56-60 units for BA, 69-73 units for BS – Ecology emphasis; 71-75 units for BA, 84-88 units for BS – Environmental Studies emphasis (not including 6 recommended units for BA/BS).
