Parker J. Palmer is a luminary in the field of leadership. He is known for his work in education, spirituality, and social change in institutions including schools and colleges, community organizations, and businesses. Parker J. Palmer is the author of seven books, including *A Hidden Wholeness: The Journey Toward an Undivided Life*, *The Courage to Teach: Exploring the Inner Landscape of a Teacher’s Life*, and *Let Your Life Speak: Listening for the Voice of Vocation*. His writing has been recognized with eight honorary doctorates and a number of national awards. He holds a Ph.D. from the University of California at Berkeley and lives in Madison, Wisconsin.
