

Maxx H. Wendell Memorial Scholarship Fund

In December, 2007 Maxx Wendell, a junior and Humanities major at Dominican whose mother has worked on campus for 17 years, (7 in the library), died from a rare and aggressive T-Cell Lymphoma. Maxx had just turned 21. In his memory, the Wendell family has established a scholarship fund to assist 3 sophomores, or above, majoring in the Humanities or Natural Sciences with individual stipends to purchase books. The first three students to receive scholarship funds in Spring 2013 will be selected by Financial Services based upon the recommendations of Professors Sandy Chin, Sibdas Ghosh and Gay Lynch.


Anyone interested in contributing to this fund may do so in two ways. The first is to access the online link to the Dominican [Make A Gift](#) page.

Fill in the amount, and then, under the heading "Giving Opportunities/Designations," click the radio button "Other." The Maxx H. Wendell Scholarship option will be listed on the bottom right under the heading Campus and Community. Donations may also be made by check to Dominican University of California and mailed to the attention of Sarah Andrews, Director of Advancement with the name of the scholarship written in the notation line.

Finally, a close friend of Maxx has established a website and is offering *Destroy Cancer* T-shirts for \$15.00 a piece, \$5.00 of which will be directly donated to Dominican University for students who qualify for these scholarship funds. Recent T-Shirt sales have resulted in a donation of \$692.00 to this memorial fund.
