<b>10. Religion*</b>	
<p><b>Day:</b></p> <p>a. one course in Judeo-Christian tradition – <i>3 units</i></p> <p>b. one upper division course – <i>3 units</i></p> <p><b>Day students with 45 or more transfer units or second degree candidates are only required to complete 3 upper division units in Judeo-Christian religion to fulfill the Religion requirement.</b></p> <p><b>Pathways:</b></p> <p>a. one course in Judeo-Christian tradition – <i>3 units</i></p> <p>b. one course in World Religions – <i>3 units</i></p> <p><b>Pathways students with 45 or more transfer units or second degree candidates are only required to complete 3 units in World Religions to fulfill the Religion requirement.</b></p>	<p>a. <b>11. Cultural Heritage Colloquium (Day)/Interdisciplinary Study (Pathways)*</b>	
<p>Three interrelated <i>3-unit</i> courses that investigate a particular era, theme, or geographical area (<i>9 units total</i>).</p>	<p>Courses in the following disciplines will fulfill this requirement: Art History, Comparative Religion, Ethnic Studies, History, History of the Natural Sciences, Humanities, International Relations, Literature including the literature of other languages, Philosophy, Political Theory, etc.</p>

For transfer students with 45-69 units, the total colloquium requirement is only 6 units. For transfer students with 70 or more units or second degree candidates, the total requirement is only 3 units. Transfer students who need 3-6 units will fulfill the CHC requirement by choosing with their advisor courses that study a particular era, theme, or geographical area. Those transfer students who need to complete the full (9 unit) CHC requirement must do so by taking the Cultural Heritage Colloquia offered at Dominican University.
