Assessing Obama's Foreign Policy Legacy

As Barack Obama enters the final two years of his presidency, the US faces numerous challenges and opportunities in China, Russia, Europe, the Middle East and South Asia. Dr. Neil Joeck will offer his assessment of the issues and options. The President himself has likened his final two years to the fourth quarter of a football game - plenty of time left on the clock to accomplish many of his foreign policy objectives. His critics claim he is too far behind to compensate for his fumbles in the first three quarters. What will be Obama's foreign policy legacy?

Dr. Joeck came to Berkeley after a distinguished career in government service. He was employed initially as an intelligence analyst at the Livermore National Laboratory, then served on the State Department's Policy Planning Staff, and later became Director for Counter Proliferation Strategy at the White House. Named National Intelligence Officer for South Asia in 2009, he often briefed the President directly on developments in Pakistan and Afghanistan
