

**Dominican University of California

Fanjeaux, France**



**WHAT:** Two grants of **\$1,550** each are available for Dominican University of California faculty and staff to attend and participate in the annual summer seminar that is held in Fanjeaux, France, and which ends with four days in Paris. The seminar welcomes participants of all religious affiliations.

**WHEN:** **29 May - 14 June 2006**

**WHERE:** Fanjeaux, France (and a few days in Paris)

**COST:** \$1,550 includes daily seminar presentations, full room and board in Fanjeaux, room and breakfast in Paris and daily tours in southern France. Airfare is additional and will be about \$1,000 from San Francisco. **(With grant, cost to participant is about \$1,000.)**

The Summer Seminar in southern France is for faculty and staff of Dominican colleges and universities in the U.S. (Wes Young and Mary Ann Haeuser attended in 1998; Sherry Volk in 1999; Bob Haberman and Alan Schut in 2000; Ruth Ramsey and Grace Grant in 2001; Martha Nelson and Crystal Anderson in 2002; Matt Davis, Laurie Isenberg, and Irene Morganson in 2003; John Kennedy, Mary Crosby, and Craig Singleton in 2004; and Susan Roddy and Marianne Stickel in 2005. Sr. Patty has been on the staff for nine years.) A study program for students is offered during the same time frame. Faculty, staff, and administrators reflect together on the Dominican vision then and now. Conversations involve the intellectual tradition of the Dominicans (e.g. aesthetics and theology) and the curriculum (e.g. justice and diversity issues). The seminar offers the opportunity to discuss implications for Dominican colleges and universities today.

Visit many interesting sites in southern France, including places that are special to the Dominican Order's early years. Proposed plans for the daily tours from Fanjeaux include Prouilhe, Toulouse, Carcassonne, Albi, Collioure (on the Mediterranean), Montsegur, Grottes de Niaux (prehistoric paintings), and Chateau de Puilaurens.

**Criteria for selection of the Dominican University Faculty Grant for the Summer Seminar:**

- Dominican University full-time member interested in participating and advancing the University community's dialogue about the Dominican mission and educational philosophy.
- Willingness to serve on a Dominican Dialogue committee that will seek to propose methods by which the Dominican history and mission can be communicated to campus constituencies.
