



Sanctions

- I. The following sanctions may be imposed upon any student found to have violated the Student Code:
 - i. **Warning** - A notice in writing to the student that the student is violating or has violated the institutions regulations.
 - ii. **Disciplinary Probation** – A written reprimand for violation of specific regulations. Probation is for a designated period of time and includes the probability of more severe disciplinary sanctions if the student is found to violate any institutional regulation(s) during the probationary period.
 - iii. **Loss of Privileges** – Denial of specific privileges for a designated period of time.
 - iv. **Fines** – Previously established and published fines may be imposed.
 - v. **Restitution** – Compensation for loss, damage or injury. This may take the form of appropriate service and/or monetary or material replacement.
 - vi. **Residence Hall Exclusion** - Permanent separation of the student for the University residence Halls.
 - vii. **University Suspension** - Separation of the student from the University for a definite period of time, after which the student is eligible to return. Conditions for readmission may be specified.
 - viii. **No Contact Directive** – A written document indicating no contact between two or more parties at the institution.
 - ix. **University Expulsion** - Permanent separation of the student from the University.
 - x. **Educational Sanctions** - Work assignments, essays, service to the University, reflections, mandated workshops and other related assignments.
 - xi. **Other Sanctions** – In its discretion, other necessary sanctions may be imposed by the University as circumstances require.
- II. More than one of the listed sanctions above may be imposed for any single violation.
- III. Other than University expulsion disciplinary sanctions shall not be made part of the student’s permanent academic record, but shall be part of the student’s disciplinary record. Upon graduation, the student disciplinary record may be expunged of disciplinary actions.
- IV. The following sanctions may be imposed upon groups or organizations:
 - i. Those sanctions listed in Article IV (2)(i)-(xi)



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- ii. Deactivation. Loss of privileges, including University recognition for a specific period of time.

2. Interim Measures

I. Suspension

- i. Interim suspension may be imposed only:
 - 1. To ensure the health and safety of members of the University community or preservation of University property.
 - 2. To ensure the student's own physical or emotional safety and well-being
 - 3. If the student poses an on-going threat of disruption of, or interference with, the normal operations of the University.
- ii. During the interim suspension, a student shall be denied access to the residence halls and/or to the campus (including classes) and/or all other University activities or privileges for which the student might otherwise be eligible, as the Director of Student Rights and Responsibilities may determine appropriate.
- iii. The interim suspension does not replace the regular process, which shall proceed on the normal schedule, up to and through the Student Conduct Hearing.

II. Housing Relocation

- i. Housing relocation may be imposed only:
 - 1. To ensure the health and safety of members of the University community or preservation of University property.
 - 2. To ensure the student's own physical or emotional safety and well-being
 - 3. If the student poses an on-going threat of disruption of, or interference with, the normal operations of the University.

III. No Contact Directives

- i. No Contact Directives may be issued at the beginning of the adjudication process:
 - 1. To ensure the health and safety of member of the University community.
 - 2. To ensure the student's own physical or emotional safety and well-being.
